## **Known Errata, Omissions, and Clarifications**

The following were noticed/discovered/realised subsequent to publication:

- Table 4.2, page 58; Positions are labelled as B1950, but are J2000
- Two references, quoted in the text on page 59, but missing in the bibliography:

- Figure 5.14, page 114; the four plots' y-axes are labelled "Demag. Vel / (km/s)", but should be "Percentage"
- Figure 5.19, page 122; the right hand plot's y-axis is labelled "Demag. Vel / (km/s)" but should be "Velocity / (km/s)"
- Section 5.8 Proper Motion: note that if we are seeing mostly the southern half of the disk (as was suggested earlier), and the rotation is towards the south, then this would show net *convergence* in the masers. Hence this cannot be the dominant effect accounting for the non-parametric divergence of the masers.

If you notice any other errata of the above nature, please feel free to contact me so that I can put them in here. However, don't expect me to note down here disagreements over principle, or if subsequent observations show new light on the situation (though I will of course still be interested!)
